

Theme: Ukelele

Setting: General Music Lesson for 5th Grade

Subject Analysis: This lesson includes ensemble playing introducing the accompaniment for A Hawaiian Christmas for 5th grade.

Objectives:

<u>Play:</u>	Ukelele Music from 5 th grade packet A Hawaiian Christmas Sheet Music
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Materials:

- A Hawaiian Christmas sheet music for instructor
- A Hawaiian Christmas accompaniment CD
- A Hawaiian Christmas sheet music for students (30 copies)
- 5th grade ukelele packets
- Chord charts
 - C, G7, F, D

Methods:

Day 1

1. Opening

1. Have Ukeleles and A Hawaiian Christmas out before class starts
2. Play A Hawaiian Christmas as students enter the room

2. Warm-up

1. Review Chords the students know
 - a) C, G7, F

3. Playing

1. Long Long Ago
2. Learn D Chord
 1. Show Chord chart
 2. Have students play chord and walk around to check on them
 3. Pointing to charts have students practice moving from D to various chords
 4. If C is a I chord, then what is D?
 1. Start with the ones they know and then ask about D
 2. Have them play chord progression IV – II – I – V – I

4. A Hawaiian Christmas

1. Play Song for students and have them follow along
2. Look at first line and slowly play through chord changes
 1. Use piano to play chords if needed, alternative is to touch the chord charts in time
3. Run through the piece slowly
4. At 10 minutes til, or when needed, move on to This Land is Your Land Accompaniment

5. This Land is Your Land

1. Review song and play through

6. Back-up Activities

1. Review Armed Forces Salute
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Day 2

1. Opening

1. Have Ukeleles and A Hawaiian Christmas out before class starts
2. Play A Hawaiian Christmas as students enter the room

2. Warm-up

1. Review Chords the students know
 - a) C, G7, F, D
 - b) Progressions to review with
 - c) I -V- I
 - d) I – IV – V – I
 - e) IV – II – I
 - f) IV – II – V – I

3. Playing

1. Play through tunes in Ukelele packets

4. A Hawaiian Christmas

1. Play through first verse
 1. Use piano to play chords if needed, alternative is to touch the chord charts in time
2. Work through the rest of the piece
3. When needed, move on to This Land is Your Land Accompaniment

5. This Land is Your Land

1. Review song and play through

6. Back-up Activities

1. Review American Salute

Evaluation:

Were the students able to understand how to number each chord? Could students play the chord progressions presented in the pieces? As a group, were the chords able to be heard or was it blurred?
